Pictures in *Yo! Yes?* are just as important as the words. If you read the book without looking at the pictures, the words don't tell the full story. The pictures of each character give meaning to what each of them is feeling as they say the words.

Based on the pictures, how do you think the character in the green jacket is feeling when they say "Who?" and "Me?"?

What about their faces and bodies in the pictures make you think they are feeling that way?

Based on the pictures, how do you think the character in the striped shorts feels when they say "Oh?" versus when they say "Oh!" on the next page?

What about their faces and bodies in the pictures make you think they are feeling that way?





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Based on the pictures, how do you think both characters are feeling when they say "Yo!" and "Yow!" at the end of the book?

What about their faces and bodies in the pictures make you think they are feeling that way?

Draw a picture of you and a friend, then write something you might say to each other in the empty word bubbles!
